2013 Planning

The Program and Education Committee goal this year for the program at the AAHSL Annual meeting was to present a range of topics that have impact on libraries and librarians, and serve as a catalyst for important conversations about academic health sciences libraries now and in the future.

The work of the Committee started at the 2012 Annual AAHSL meeting where we meet to review the past year, and think about the year ahead. We continued to meet regularly throughout the year via conference call.

Friday Program

There were many excellent ideas and topics put forth for the program this year by the committee, which we shared with the AAHSL leadership. Spaces, mobile compatibility with ebooks, mobile content, Inkling, community medicine were all topics discussed. The topics which were ultimately decided on did not follow one theme, but instead focused on current, relevant, up-and-coming need to know information, including massive open online courses (MOOCs) and the semantic web, work being conducted on the value of libraries, and informatics.

The Committee invited exceptional speakers for the program this year. In keeping with the format from previous years, we invited a keynote speaker for the morning, and "hot topic" speakers for the afternoon sessions. The keynote speaker, Dr. Kevin Fickenscher, is the President and Chief Executive Officer, American Medical Informatics Association (AMIA). We have four hot topic speakers, including two who are not affiliated with AAHSL: Dr. Ben Abella, is Assistant Professor of Emergency Medicine, Perelman School of Medicine, University of Pennsylvania and Attending Physician & Vice Chair of Research, Dept of Emergency Medicine;

and Clinical Research Director, Center for Resuscitation Science, Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Parsa Mirhaji, M.D., Ph.D. is an Assistant Professor, Department of Systems & Computational Biology, Director of Clinical Research Informatics at Albert Einstein College of Medicine and Montefiore Medical Center. Julia Sollenberger, MLS, AHIP, FMLA, is the Associate VP and Director, Medical Center Libraries and Technologies, University of Rochester Medical Center. Carol Jenkins, is the now retired Director of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Health Sciences Library. Jim Curtis, is the Interim Director of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Health Sciences Library and M.J. Tooey, MLS, AHIP, FMLA, is AAHSL President and Associate Vice President, Academic Affairs Executive Director Health Sciences and Human Services Library University of Maryland.
